Since launching PolioPlus in 1985, Rotary and partners have reduced polio cases by 99.9%, protecting millions of children. Today, wild poliovirus remains only in Afghanistan and Pakistan. Rotary continues leading efforts to finish eradication and create a polio-free world.

Rotary commits to raising US\$50 million per year, with each dollar matched by two dollars from the Gates Foundation.
